



Call for Proposals: Due May 17

PACS Small Grants Program

As a leading research center dedicated to developing and sharing knowledge that can create positive social change, Stanford PACS is committed to supporting and nurturing promising new scholars interested in the study of philanthropy and civil society. In this spirit, the center offers a number of small grants each quarter to support student research in related areas. In addition to financial support, we also invite our small grants recipients to engage with the broader Stanford PACS community and learn from established scholars, practitioners, and leaders of social change.

*****TO APPLY*****

Eligibility: Stanford PACS small grants welcome applications from all Stanford students. The grant typically supports undergraduate honors theses, masters' students' capstone projects, and doctoral student research. Eligible expenses could include database purchases, travel expenses, conference fees, transcription or translation services, or other expenses related to data collection, analysis, and dissemination.

Funding: The grant amounts typically range from \$1,000 to \$4,000 to undergraduate and graduate Stanford students who are pursuing research related to philanthropy or civil society.

Application Requirements: Complete applications will include the following:

1. A curriculum vitae
2. A one- to two-page proposal describing your research topic and process. Please be sure to note the connection to work at PACS
3. An itemized budget that explains what the funds would support
4. A letter of recommendation from your project advisor

Deadline: The Spring 2024 Small Grants deadline is **5pm Friday May 17th**. **Submit proposals here** and have your **project advisors send your letters to Lisa Overbey at loverbey@stanford.edu with "PACS Small Grants" in the subject line.**

Announcement: All applicants will be notified of their status in early June.
